WHEREAS, on November 4, 2008, residents of Natrona County will vote on a general obligation bond that would raise \$35,000,000 for new and renovated classrooms, labs and office space at Casper College, including a new Gateway/Training and Development Center, major remodeling of the Administration Building to add space for health science labs and instruction, a Student Union/UW/CC building, a new Music Building, and remodel of the Aley building to accommodate the growing science program at Casper College; and

WHEREAS, the economic impact of Casper College on the local economy totals \$304.3 million yearly; and

WHEREAS, Casper College provides direct workforce training for employers and students; and

WHEREAS, Casper College needs additional space to respond to the changing professional needs of Wyoming's economy; and
