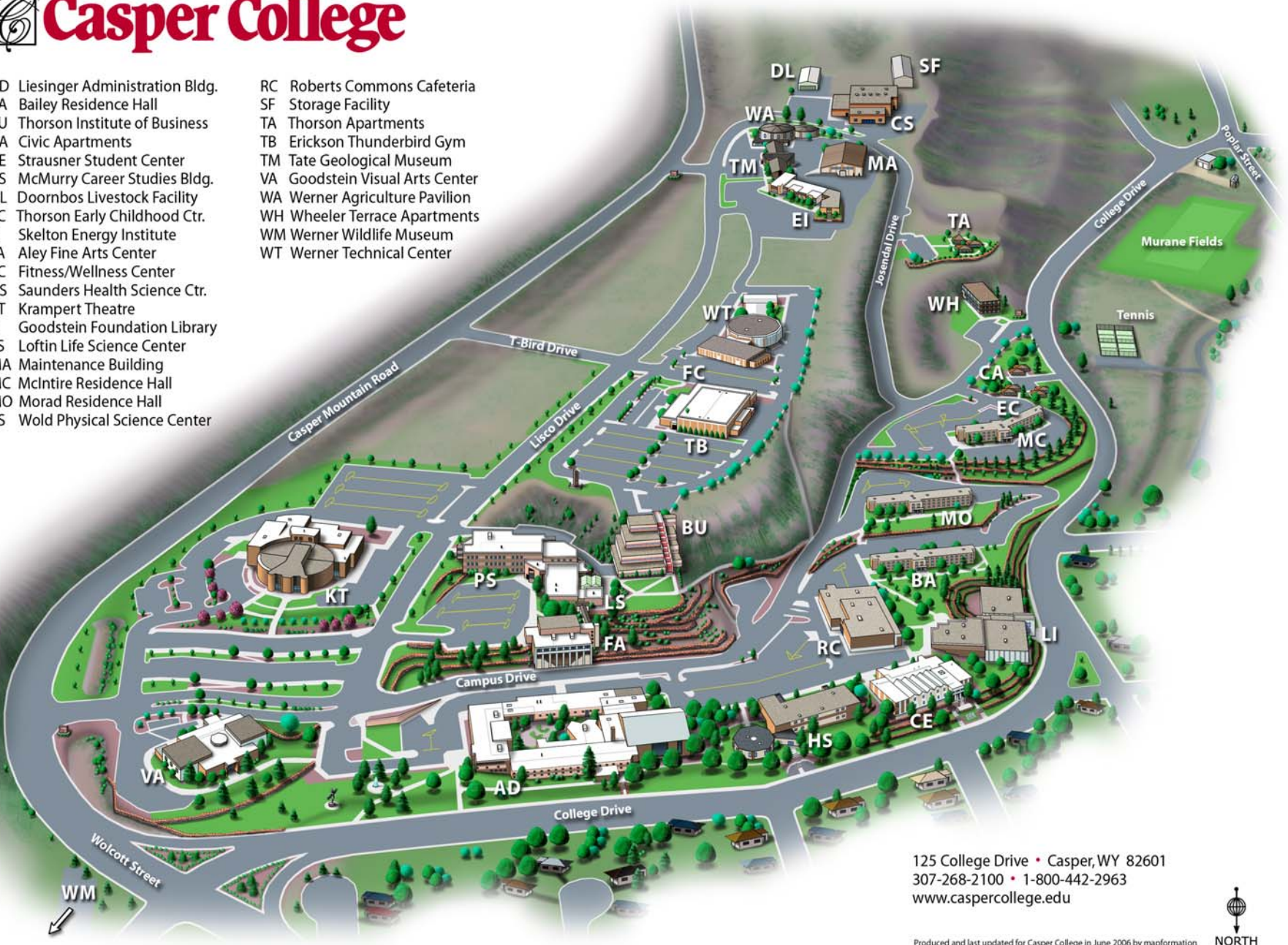

Athletic Training	AS			<p>As of 11/21/05 there are 315 nationally advertised positions in Athletic Training (60 in the west and 15 in the region) that remain unfilled. There are currently about 20 positions in Wyoming. The Wyoming Athletic Trainers Association is recommending that this program be expanded substantially to cover more athletic programs in the state.</p> <p>This program is designed to follow exactly the curriculum for the freshman and sophomore years leading to a B.S. Degree in Athletic Training at the University of Wyoming. In addition, Boise State has expressed an interest in accepting our students. We have a clinical relationship involving accredited clinical instructors at Natrona County High School and Kelly Walsh High Schools, as well as Casper Orthopedics.</p>
Auto Body Repair Technology	AAS, CER	2006		<p>Requested by the local business community, and in response to student interest.</p> <p>There are few accredited schools offering an auto body program within a five state area surrounding Wyoming. Currently the town of Casper facilitates a Regional Training Center focused on automotive painting located at Wyoming Automotive Refinishing Supply. This facility hosts training seminars and short courses to update professionals employed throughout a five state area. They are willing to offer their facilities in conjunction with facilities at Casper College to better train potential employees. This will help meet the shortage of qualified personnel.</p> <p>Employment demand and salary potential for program graduates: Statistics for 2004 indicate: Auto Body Repair rates 116 out of 305 of the fastest growing occupations for Wyoming and 369 out of 559 nationally.</p> <p>It is projected that a 10% employment increase will occur at the national level by the year 2014 and a 23% employment increase will occur at the state level by the year 2012.</p> <p>Median wage for Wyoming Hourly \$15.96 Annual \$33,200</p> <p>Based on a polling (executed by R. Waldron, Automotive Technology Instructor, and D. Miller, Welding Technology Instructor) of local auto body businesses in Casper, it was determined that 80% of those businesses were looking to hire one to three new employees in the next year provided that qualified personnel were available.</p> <p>Local business, MARMAC, opens an entirely new opportunity for auto body technicians in the field of truck body repair. MARMAC has identified shortages in the work force of this industry throughout Wyoming and Colorado. The auto body program will be capable of training entry level technicians for both auto body and truck body repair.</p>

Graphic Design	AFA	2007		<p>The new degree in Graphic Design will meet the needs of students interested in utilizing software for media design as a foundation for transfer to a four-year degree. This degree has been formulated by both visual arts faculty and student requests, and will be reviewed by our arts accrediting body - NASAD. This new plan reflects, in part, comments from our last NASAD visitors' report and is consistent with AIGA standards.</p> <p>The need for graphic designers in all areas grows daily as businesses utilize a variety of media options for communication and advertising. Casper College has recently hired several graphic designers in the areas of both staff for the College Relations office and faculty.</p> <p>As per conversations with professionals in the field, such as the owner and director of the Casper agency ADBAY, demand for professionals in the state and region is high. Casper College currently has several students working in the field, even though these stakeholders do not have all the required training yet. This implies a strong need for graphic designers in the area.</p> <p>The median salary for an entry level designer is round \$32,000 per year. Opportunities for free-lance designers are plentiful – nearly 3 in 10 designers are involved in their own business. The average yearly salary reported for this type of work is \$60,000, and top designers can easily earn more than \$100,000 annually. The job outlook for this field is growing. Demand for graphic design continues to increase, especially from advertisers, publishers, and computer design firms.</p>

This enrollment may impact financial aid for students as they are not considered degree-seeking until they are actually admitted to a program. Medical Laboratory Technician	AS	2005		<p>Wyoming Healthcare Industry Survey A survey was developed to determine if Medical Laboratory Technicians were presently employed within the State of Wyoming, how many Medical Laboratory Technician personnel would be required within the next year or three years, the need to provide Medical Laboratory Technician graduates for employment, and general questions on salary and willingness to serve as a clinical affiliate. Thirty-one surveys were distributed to hospitals, private laboratories and health care institutions. Data was compiled based upon 16 respondents.</p> <p>Survey results indicate there is a need for medical laboratory personnel. The difficulty in finding qualified laboratory personnel is already evident with 9 respondents indicating that it was somewhat or very difficult to find skilled, qualified workers. Fourteen of the 16 respondents stated that they would be hiring full time medical laboratory technology personnel in the next year and all respondents stated they would be hiring personnel within the next three years. Additionally, 11 respondents indicated that there was a need for Casper College to provide Medical Laboratory Technician graduates and 13 respondents stated they would be willing to serve as clinical training sites.</p> <p>Wyoming Medical Laboratory Personnel Vacancy Wyoming healthcare institutions have resorted to national advertisements to recruit qualified, skilled, certified laboratory personnel. As early as September, 2002 advertisements began to appear in the biweekly publication ADVANCE: For Medical Laboratory Professionals. Four advertisements were placed in 2003, 8 by 2004, and advertisements for 2005 have appeared in January, February, March and April issues. As the need for certified personnel increases, the demand for graduates from the MLT program will also increase. Providing regional graduates will help to fill vacancies here in Wyoming.</p> <p>Collectively, survey results and job advertisements indicate that the present demand for Casper College MLT graduates is 7-15 per year. The degree is especially appropriate for students interested in art, historical, or anthropological informal learning institutions and allows focus in other areas such as geology or paleontology.</p> <p>In Casper, students could find potential work at several museums/galleries including The Nicolaysen Art Museum and Discovery Center, Fort Casper, The Tate, and The Historic Trails Interpretive Center. There is also a demand for these students regionally in cities such as Denver, Salt Lake City, Boulder, and Jackson Hole. The salary is dependent on the employment venue location. Several area museums have indicated support for this proposed program. This program also allows for student transfer to a four-year program and graduate program in the field. Several institutions offer these types of programs at Bachelor's or Master's level.</p> <p>Students in existing degree plans have accepted positions at regional museums, but rarely have the students had professional training that facilitates their career. Both the Science Zone and the Nicolaysen Art Museum in Casper have indicated a desire for this type of preparation for potential employees. Informal learning institutions such as museums and galleries are also found to be catalysts for economic development through the promotion of tourism and the enhancement of the quality of life in the community.</p>

Phlebotomy Technician Training	CER	2006		<p>There is a 7.9% vacancy rate for phlebotomy technicians as reported in the American Society for Clinical Pathology Wage and Vacancy Survey (Lab Medicine, August, 2006, Vol 37,#8) This same survey reported an average salary of \$14.00 per hour in the Far West Region.</p> <p>Casper College was asked by our community to provide training for phlebotomists several years ago. We answered that call by putting both MLTK 1800 (Principles of Phlebotomy) and MLTK 1970 (Phlebotomy Practicum) into place. As a result, Casper was able to attract BioLife Plasma Services, and students completing these courses were employed both there and at Wyoming Medical Center.</p> <p>Although the certificate program was considered at that time, it was never submitted to the Commission. We have since reconsidered, and we believe this proposed 13 credit certificate will be beneficial to our graduates. It would be the first step in a career ladder that includes Phlebotomist (one semester certificate), Medical Laboratory Technician (AS degree), and Medical Technologist (BS degree).</p> <p>Program design was collaborative between Casper College faculty, local, private laboratories, national certification and accrediting agencies, respondents of Casper College Wyoming Healthcare Industry Survey and consultation with other clinical laboratory educators. Program curriculum utilizes many existing courses currently offered by the Medical Laboratory Technician, English, Political Science, and Computer Technology departments. Published examination content outlines for the American Society for Clinical Pathology (ASCP) and the National Credentialing Agency for Laboratory Personnel (NCA) were used as curriculum guidelines in discerning which existing courses were appropriate for course offering in phlebotomy principles and practicum (MLTK 1800 and 1970 respectively).</p>

<p>Robotics Technology</p>	<p>AAS, CER</p>	<p>2007</p>		<p>Wyoming oil and gas, as well as mining industries, are using some robotic control already in their operations. Many companies would like to use more robots. This program will prepare technicians to maintain, repair and modify robots.</p> <p>Casper College has successfully participated in the FIRST Robotics competition for several years. This project has been nearly fully funded by the Central Wyoming Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES). Students from both the local high schools and the college are enrolled in both ELTR 1610 (Introduction to Robotics) and ELTR 1615 (Competition Robotics I). They work together on the design and construction of a competitive robot each year. More recently, a Lego Robotics competition has been introduced at the junior high level, which is also funded through a grant provided by BOCES. The hope is that we will spark an earlier interest in math and science, and students will then matriculate into the dual enrollment courses in Robotics being offered at the high school level.</p> <p>Interest in Robotics in Casper has increased greatly over the past six months. The McMurry Training Center has conducted several meetings with Kuka, a German Robotics company. There is a potential that trained robotics technicians will be in great demand if the Center is successful in convincing them to relocate a branch in Casper. Whether or not this comes to fruition, our graduates will easily find employment with the background provided by this course of study.</p> <p>Finally, the recent interest in Robotics has led the Science Zone, our local science education center, to bring in a display called the "Robot Zoo". Current planning has a scaled version of this national exhibit slated for opening in January in Casper. This is a fantastic opportunity to work with our local educators and students. If this degree program is approved, we plan to market it heavily during this time to highlight career opportunities for our students.</p>

Statistics	AAS, CER	2007	<p>An Applied Statistics degree will provide all the knowledge and instruction in common procedures that any student in the Social/Behavioral or Biological Science would need for any required research in the Upper Division to obtain a Bachelor's degree (in fact, for anything through first year of graduate school). This degree will similarly allow employed students to upgrade to a higher job status in situations where data analysis is a major component of their area.</p> <p>In an exploratory meeting, several local businesses and governmental agencies, the school district, and WMC expressed support for this certificate program as a way to upgrade statistical knowledge among their employees.</p> <p>In an exploratory meeting conducted in December 2006, several local businesses and governmental agencies, the school district, and Wyoming Medical Center expressed support for this program as a way to upgrade statistical knowledge among their employees. Since such students are full-time employees, the certificate program will eventually be offered on-line in its entirety. This will also allow it to reach a national pool of potential students. They also expressed that job candidates (as well as current employees) are much more attractive with additional statistical training.</p> <p>In order to determine the demand for applied statisticians in Central Wyoming, the aforementioned exploratory meeting was conducted at Casper College. All involved expressed support for both a two-year degree in applied statistics and an online certificate. Since potential employees would need other skills as well, they articulated that a degree in statistics would make employees much more desirable to hire. In addition, they stated that they would be extremely interested in sending current employees through the Certificate program to gain additional statistical proficiency. If this proposed program is approved, the participants from our exploratory group would become the basis of an advisory committee.</p>
