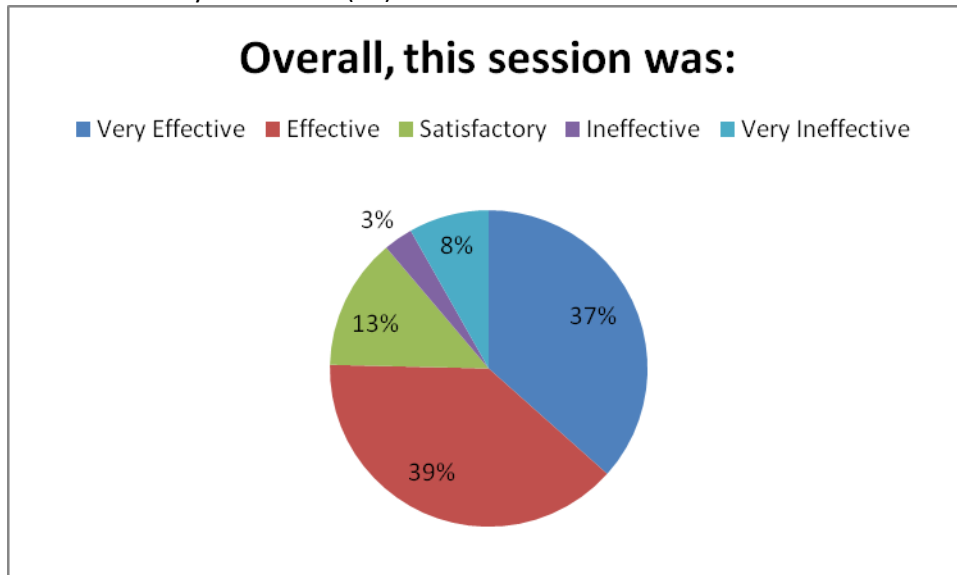

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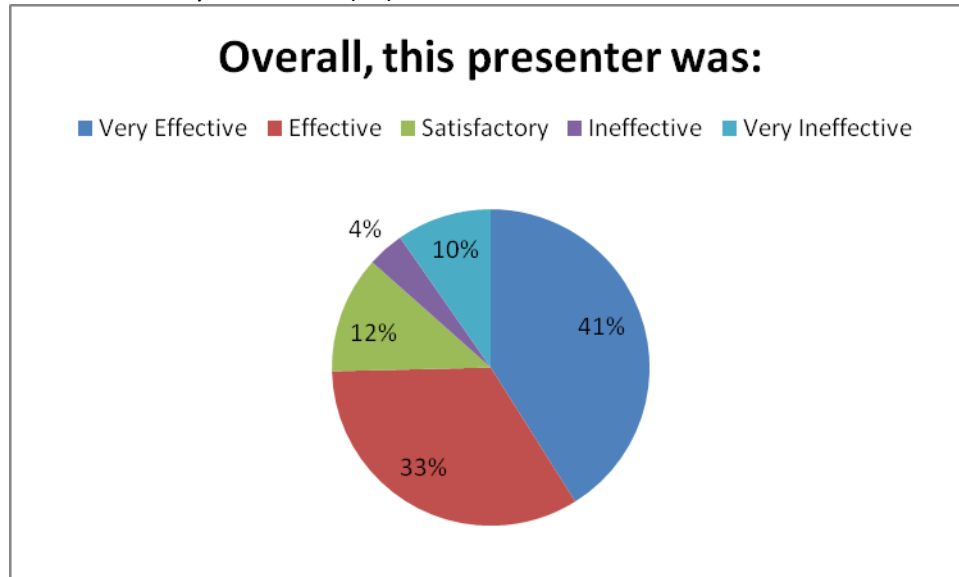
Center for Excellence Informational Sessions January – June 2010

- The Center for Excellence served just over 180 employees during January – June 2010 by offering over 51 informational sessions.
 - Attendance for all 51 sessions totaled to 320 employees.
 - 32 different topics were offered including, but not limited to, distance education, informational technology, teaching tips, staff development, assessment, and campus resources. Most of these sessions were evaluated by participants. The results of those evaluations are below:
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- 134 responses were received on Survey Monkey from 47 Center for Excellence sessions
 - Participants were asked 7 questions regarding their experience at the Center for Excellence informational session they attended:
