Northeast Perspective



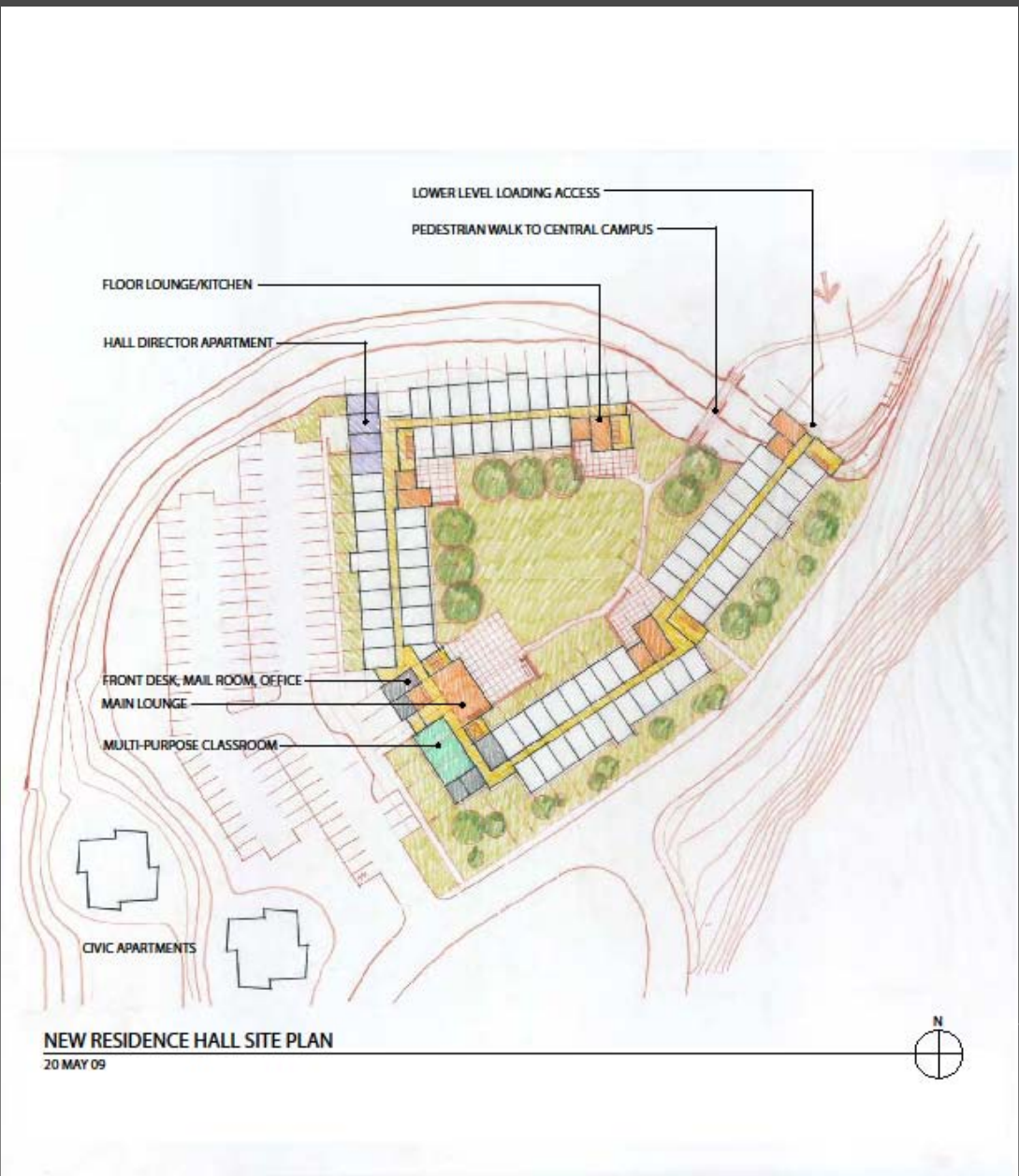
Courtyard

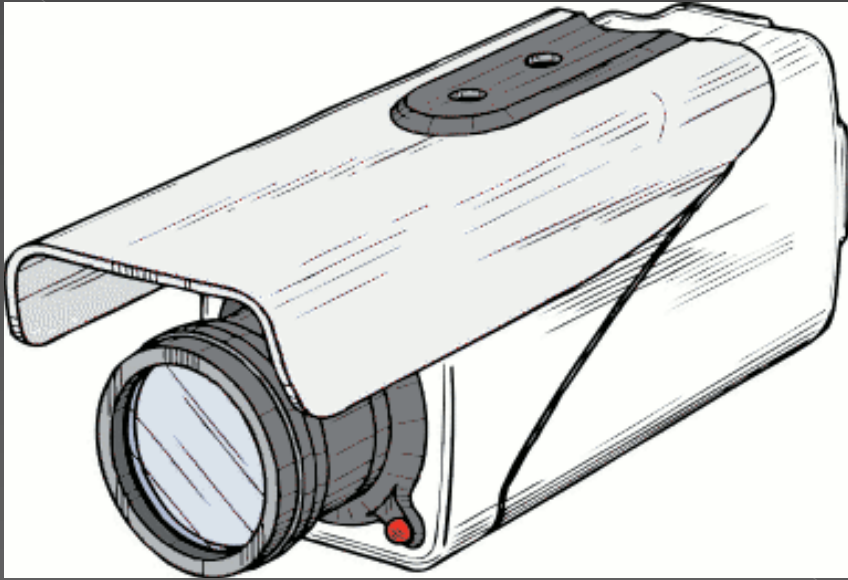
- Will provide extra outdoor programming space.

- Wireless Internet



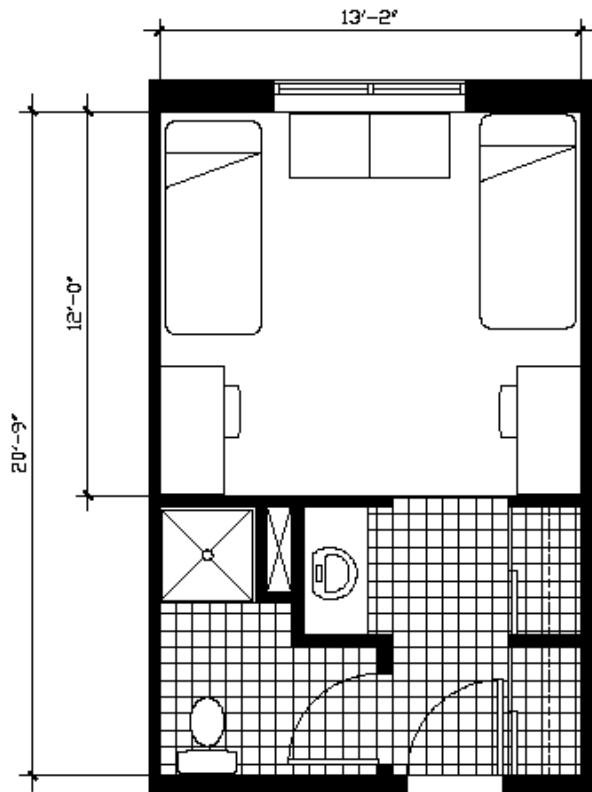


State-of-the-Art Security System

Double Occupancy Room
