Activities professionals provide elderly and disabled clients opportunities to support and enhance their social, mental, creative, spiritual, and recreational needs. These professionals work in a variety of settings to include: long-term care facilities, retirement homes, assisted living centers, adult day care centers, and senior centers.

Casper College offers a choice of three options for the student who is interested in the activities professional program. The first option would be to register as a nondegree seeking student and take the four classes that comprise the Wyoming State Approved Training Course. The second and third options require that you register as a degree-seeking student. You can then enroll for the certificate program or the associate of applied science degree program.
