Academic Policies

Course Prerequisites

Students are responsible for knowing and completing all course prerequisites.

Graduation Requirements

Application for Graduation
A candidate for graduation must file an application for graduation with the office of the registrar. A degree or certificate evaluation and an application for graduation should be completed and on file in the Office of the Registrar before the candidate's final semester registration.

Institutional Requirements

To graduate from Casper College a student must complete at least 12 of the last 15 semester hours applied toward graduation as a degree-seeking student at Casper College. This requirement may be waived at the discretion of the Vice President of Academic Affairs.

Advising

Casper College Education students are required to meet with their advisor prior to registering for courses in any semester. Registration continues through the last Friday before the starting day of each semester.

Course Load

The student's course load is measured in credit hours enrolled in each semester. A student enrolled for 12 or more credit hours is considered full-time, although 16 credit hours is the average course load required to complete an associate degree in the normal two-year program. Students are encouraged to take as full a course load as is compatible with their objectives, capabilities, and responsibilities. Recommended course loads based on work hours is listed below.

Employed Hours	Enrolled Credit Hours
40 hours per week	6-9 credit hours
30 hours per week	8-11 credit hours
20 hours per week	10-13 credit hours

The recommended maximum course load is 19 credit hours in any semester. Special approval is required to exceed this level and is granted only in special circumstances to students with good academic records.
