Roommate Contract

Purpose of the Contract

The purpose of this contract is to give residents sharing a room the opportunity to examine each other's personal living style and preferences, while ensuring that the rights of each individual resident are respected. Learning to accept each other's differences without infringing upon on another's freedom is an invaluable part of your learning experience. At the beginning of the semester, we will require residents to set aside time to discuss the following questions with their roommate, and residents will be required at the beginning of their second semester to review and/or modify this contract. By dedicating adequate time to these questions now, you will hopefully avoid future conflicts. Take time to complete this contract and explain each of you responses. Be as honest and specific as possible.

Remember, communication is the key to the success of your roommate experience at Casper College!

General Expectations

In addition to abiding by the current housing terms and conditions, Casper College housing expects you to establish and maintain a healthy relationship with your roommate.

- Know and abide by the current housing terms and conditions
- Respect the right of others to read, study, and sleep free from undue interference. Unreasonable noise and other distractions inhibit the exercise of these rights
- Respect your roommate's right to free access to the room
- It is a privilege to have guests in the room. Both you and your guests must respect the rights of your roommate and other hall members
- It is everyone's responsibility to keep the building clean and tidy even yours!
- Respect your roommate's belongings they are not yours
- Respect the personal privacy of others
- Settle conflicts peacefully. Both your RA and Area Coordinator are willing to assist you in resolving conflicts
- No one has the right to intimidate or cause physical or emotional harm to another
- While the housing staff will assist you in resolving problems, it is your responsibility to actively participate in the solution

Roommate Bill of Rights

- The right to study free from undue interference (i.e. noise, guests, lights, etc.) in one's room
- The right to sleep free from undue disturbance (i.e. noise, guests, lights, etc.) in one's room
- The right to expect the respect of one's personal belongings
- The right to a clean and tidy environment in which to live
- The right to free access to one's room and facilities without pressure from roommates
- The right to expect one's roommate will not violate the current Housing Terms and Conditions
- The right to be free from harassment and discrimination
- The right to expect that any and all disagreements will be discussed in an atmosphere of openness and mutual respect, and that it is acceptable to confront one's roommate when the roommate is not fulfilling mutual agreements
